

Animals in Zoos

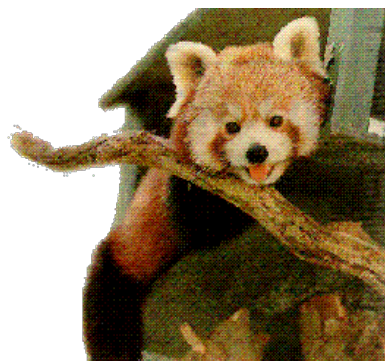
This task is about developing an argument about keeping animals in zoos.
