c)	Adult plumage is grey or black wings with black or white body.	
d)	Gulls' colourings are drab and dull.	
e)	Gulls usually live around harbours, sea coasts, and lakes.	
f)	Gulls breed in colonies in nests made of seaweed, sticks, and grass.	
g)	Egg hatching is shared by both parents.	
h)	Chicks are covered with mottled down when hatched.	
i)	Gulls are undesirable birds because they are scavengers.	
j)	Gulls contribute absolutely nothing to the world of the seashore.	
k)	The black-backed gull is the most common type of gull.	
l)	Gulls make a harsh, squawking sound, which is very unpleasant to the ear.	
m)	The red-billed gull has pearly-grey back and wings.	
n)	The red-billed gull is the most attractive of the gulls.	
o)	The black-billed gull is found only in New Zealand.
