Looking at insects

There are more than three-quarters of a million kinds of insect and there are many insects of each kind. It's no wonder some of them ¹ nuisances and get in our way. ² have to have food, but some ³ food we want to have for ⁴. They eat the grain grown on ⁵ farms and the vegetables in our ⁶ and the fruit in our orchards. ⁷ we find a worm-eaten apple we usually say, "One of our six-legged neighbours ⁸ here first". However, the "worms" in ⁹ are not real worms but baby ¹⁰ called larvae. Many insects are like ¹¹ when they are young. Some of ¹² worm-like baby insects we call caterpillars; ¹³ we call grubs. Some insects even ¹⁴ to our tables and try to ¹⁵ food off our plates, like house-flies. ¹⁶ insects are our enemies because they harm our forest and garden trees. They ¹⁷ eat the leaves, or bore into ¹⁸ trunk or roots. Other insects chew ¹⁹ in our clothes, and they may ²⁰ our books or sometimes damage the ²¹ our furniture is made of. But, ²² most harmful insects are those that ²³ deadly diseases: flies, fleas, mosquitoes, and lice. ²⁴ are our greatest enemies!
