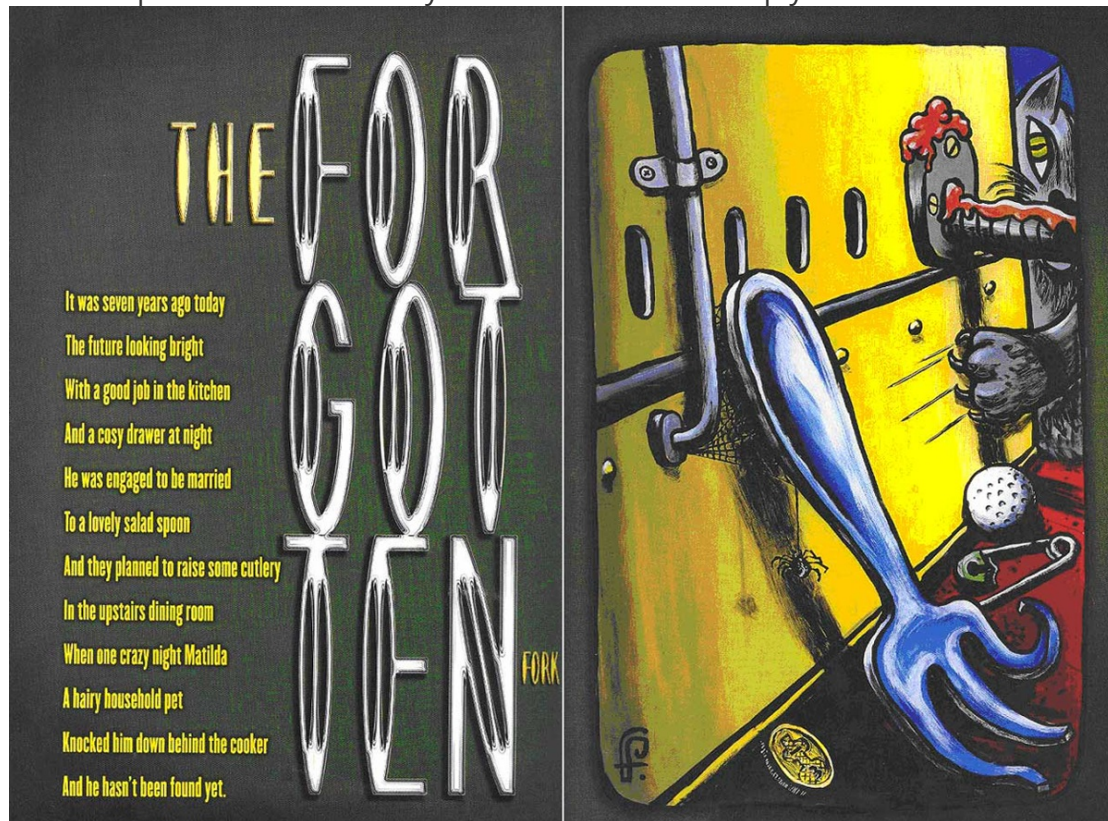


The Forgotten fork I
