

Visiting the dinosaurs

The machine landed James and Lyn on a beach. "Look at these dinosaur tracks," said Lyn.




How many different types of dinosaurs had walked on this part of the beach?


They decided that it would be safer in the forest. They came to a gap in the trees, and there in front of them was a brontosaurus. The animal was in a swamp.
